

ANNEX 1– FROZEN FISH PRODUCTS THAT CANNOT BE ADDED WITH PHOSPHATES
(REF: PARAGRAPH 8 OF MAIN CONSULTATION DOCUMENT)

CODEX STANDARD	SCOPE OF PRODUCTS UNDER THE STANDARD
Standard for Quick Frozen Raw Squid (CODEX STAN 191-1995)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Quick frozen raw squid and parts of raw squid, as defined* below and offered for direct consumption without further processing. It does not apply to products indicated as intended for further processing or for other industrial purpose. <p>[*Quick frozen squid and parts of squid are obtained from squid species of the following families:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) <i>Loliginidae</i> (ii) <i>Ommastrephidae</i>.]
Live Abalone and for Raw Fresh Chilled or Frozen Abalone for Direct Consumption or for Further Processing (CODEX STAN 312-2013)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Frozen abalone of the genus <i>haliotis</i>. Frozen abalone may be whole or shucked with the viscera removed. The epithelium, mucous and radula may be removed. Frozen abalone may be intended for direct consumption or further processing.
Standard for Quick Frozen Finfish, Uneviscerated and Eviscerated (CODEX STAN 36-1981)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Frozen finfish, uneviscerated and eviscerated.
Standard for Live and Raw Bivalve Molluscs (CODEX STAN 292-2008)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Frozen raw bivalve molluscs that may be whole or shucked and/or processed to reduce or limit target organisms while essentially retaining the sensory characteristics of live bivalve molluscs. The raw bivalve molluscs may be intended for direct consumption or further processing. The raw bivalve molluscs do not include scallops when the final product is the adductor muscle only.
